

POLLUTION CONTROL PLAN

1. Captains of recreational craft in Port shall avoid the release of petroleum products into the marine waters of the Port.
2. In the event of pollution originating from a vessel, the crew on the vessel shall take all measures to stop and remove the pollution.
3. The detection of oil pollution in the marine waters of the Port shall be reported immediately to the Port Steward.
4. The Port Steward shall promptly inform:

5. The Harbour Master shall inform the Border Guard Maritime Rescue Co-ordination Centre of the situation, Tel: 639 9500 and the management of Nordic Contractors, Tel: 627 20 20
6. At the same time that the information is being conveyed, the containment and cleanup of the pollution in the marine waters shall commence involving the crews of those vessels in Port.
7. The Harbour Master shall be in charge of the removal of the pollution and responsible for its performance.
8. To contain oil pollution, the following means are available:
 - absorbent booms, 6 pcs, 10 metres each.
 - absorbent powder, 1 m³
9. Booms shall be deployed as per the attached diagram (Annex 2: Pos. 1; 2; 3)
10. Booms shall be deployed using the port boat, VLD-584.
11. Absorbent powder shall be used to remove oil pollution.
12. All means to contain and clean up pollution are found in the container (Annex 2: Pos 5).

The key to the container is located in the Port Office.
